GUESS WHO COMMUNICATION GAME

Use your communication skills to describe an animal without saying its name. Can your partner guess who you are talking about?

WHAT YOU NEED:

- Pencil or colouring pencils
- A partner or team to play the game
- A timer or stopwatch



INSTRUCTIONS



- Think of an animal. You can use the animal encyclopaedia on Dublin Zoo's website to help you pick an animal.
- Set your timer. You now have one minute to describe what your animal looks like. (Remember you cannot say its name!)



- Draw what you hear.
- When one minute is up, you have to show Person A your drawing.
- Did you get the animal right?

Switch over so that your partner is now the one describing. Play as many times as you like!

THINK ABOUT

- Its size (what is it bigger or smaller than?)
- Its colour (is it all the same colour or does it have stripes or a special pattern?)
- Its physical features (does it have wings or a tail? What about a trunk or horns?)
- How it eats (does it have a long tongue, a large beak or sharp teeth?)
- Its skin (does it have thick fur or smooth scales?)
