

Dublin Zoo is a conservation organisation based in Dublin's Phoenix Park.

It is home to over 400 animals, from snow leopards to red pandas, Asian elephants to southern white rhinos.

GETTING TO THE ZOO

There are a number of ways you can get to Dublin Zoo.





If arriving by car, you will park in the Lord's Walk car park or another area of the Phoenix Park.



You will park here if arriving by coach or private bus hire.

ARRIVING AT THE ZOO

You will enter into the Zoo here.

You can also purchase tickets to the Zoo here if you have not pre-booked online.

A member of staff will need to scan your tickets in order for you to gain entry into the Zoo.

ARRIVING AT THE ZOO




If you are coming to the Zoo with a group or if you have an annual pass, you will enter at this entrance.


Throughout the Zoo, will you see maps like this, which will help you plan your route around.

Interpretation at animal habitats will help you learn more about the different species.




Dublin Zoo's Keeper Talks are available in Irish Sign Language (ISL). These talks are available for Asian lion, red panda, Humboldt penguin, California sea lion, Asian elephant and southern white rhino.

To access the talks, scan the QR code on signage at the different habitats.



If you need help, look out for a member of Dublin Zoo's Volunteer team.

They wear red fleeces / jackets or white polo t-shirts.
